2021 Narragansett Council Cub Day Camp Guidelines

- Day Camp programs are exclusively outdoors.
- Day Camp staff are strongly encouraged to receive the vaccine prior to camp.
- Non-vaccinated campers and staff are required to wear masks when three feet of social distancing cannot be maintained outdoors (except during aquatics activities).
- Non-vaccinated campers and staff are required to wear masks and maintain 6-feet social distancing indoors (including bathrooms, trading post, and changing rooms).
- Fully vaccinated: Staff and campers need to wear masks indoors, They do not need to wear masks outdoors.
- An individual is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after their final dose.
- Campers will be assigned dens with designated staff. Campers and staff will remain with the same den during their week at camp.
- No restrictions on day camp activities.
- Increased daily sanitization of shared equipment and spaces including restrooms and changing facilities.
- Additional sanitization and handwashing stations will be provided throughout camp.
- <u>Using the COVID-19 Screening Tool</u>, families and caregivers are required to check campers for symptoms each morning and will serve as the primary screening mechanism for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Campers and staff with symptoms are required to stay home until a negative COVID-19 test can be provided.
- If a symptomatic individual tests negative, they may return to activities after their symptoms have improved and have been without fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications.
- Additional staff will be on hand to help monitor camper safety and camp sanitization.
- All staff are trained to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Campers and staff displaying symptoms of COVID-19 will be required to go home.
- Campers will receive orientation at start of camp with updated rules and procedures.
- Parents will receive an orientation email with updated rules and guidelines the week prior to their child's week at camp.
- To limit visitors in camp, family and caregivers who are picking up campers will be asked to stay in their vehicles. Camp staff will check parent or caregiver identification before dismissing campers. Pickup and drop-off procedures will be provided in the orientation email.
- The family event on Friday will not be open to families and visitors. Campers will participate and families will have a chance to view the program remotely.
- In the event of inclement weather or emergencies, campers will congregate indoors while following indoor COVID-19 procedures.
- Campers are not allowed to share food or water bottles.
- Guidelines subject to change based on updated state, CDC and BSA guidance.
