

#### **SAFETY OFFICER**

The safety officer is an older troop member knowledgeable in Scouting safety, is safety-minded in their actions and must also have the ability to teach safe practices to others. A troop should have only one safety officer but should also have a safety team in place to assist the safety officer in their duties. A safety officer is responsible for keeping safety as the number one priority for every troop member.

### Responsibilities

- understands the importance of safety in every aspect of the scouting program
- teaches basic Safety principles
- schedule/coordinate/lead safety brainstorming session before every activity and
- schedule/coordinate/lead safety debriefing session after every activity
- works with safety team to assign safety checks and inspection duties
- sets a good example
- wears the Scout uniform correctly
- lives by the Scout Oath and Law




# SAMPLE YOUTH LEADER ORGANIZATIONAL CHART FOR A LARGE TROOP
